#### ClassTag

I will use ClassTag to send any updates to parents/guardians of what we are doing in class, reminders of important upcoming events, share pictures, and communicate back and forth with family. This is not a behavior chart like many of you may be used to with ClassDojo. It is just a great way for us to communicate.

#### HOMEWORK POLICY

It has always been my attempt to rarely assign homework. I do my absolute best to make sure your student understands material before completing independent work. If your student doesn't understand something,, please encourage them to reach out to me. Your child should be able to do all of my work independently. I want you to have family time in the evenings after you get home, not stress. Encourage your child to read a book of their choice nightly (try for 20 minutes an evening or more). Eat dinner together, play games, or just relax as a family. As a parent and a teacher, I know how a homework fight can easily ruin a night!

As we are trying to get students ready for junior high school, there is a late policy that we follow. Homework is expected to be turned in the day it is due. If it is not turned in on this day, the student will have 5 days to turn in the assigned work before it turns to a zero. Students are reminded of missing assignments also, and you can keep track of your child's assignments in TeacherEase.



some stars are cuddly and soft.


some are prickly and thorny.
